OWL (Orphaned Wildlife) Rehabilitation Society is a non-profit organization whose volunteers and staff are dedicated to public education and the rehabilitation and release of injured and orphaned birds of prey. OWL became a Society in January 1985 (Registration No. S-19879.) and is licensed through Fish and Wildlife. OWL was founded and is under the direction of the executive director Bev Day.

OWL is on call seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day. OWL relies on volunteers, and public and corporate donations and sponsorships as we get no financial support from any government agency. We are always in need of donations to help feed our birds. Mice are about \$1 each that adds up so quickly during spring time babies and cold winters, keeping our cages updated are another huge cost, and medical supplies are expensive.

OWL is always in constant need of various medical supplies (please call for details), cleaning supplies, cage material (astroturf, branches, logs etc), gas cards for our ambulance and education van, flower pot bottoms for bird baths various sizes, and the list goes on.

We are always on the lookout for new volunteers! From bird care, cleaning, feeding and glove training, assisting with medical care, gardeners, carpenters, gift area helpers, rescue pick-ups, help with fundraising, tour guides, offsite and onsite education presenters.
